Extracts from the B Armstrong's Diary:

November 30th, 1880

Dined at Bylaugh Hall - a very recherche dinner - real turtle and swan & French cookery. The Lombes very cordial and kind. On our way a hawk who had captured a pigeon was scared at our carriage lamps and let it fall on the roof of the Brougham, from whence it fell into the road. On our return our man said that the hawk had no doubt returned and eaten the pigeon as the road was covered with feathers.

Advent & Christmas in an unknown Sunday 13th December lockdown situation: We are all finding lockdown difficult for many reasons. churches we are not sure what Government guidance will be surrounding the lifting of lockdown on 2nd December or what tier we will be in when we come out and what we can safely do consequently.

Advent Sunday falls on 29th November. There will be no church services that day under lockdown rules. We will be producing an Advent service for the benefice that will be published on our YouTube channel (St Nicholas' Church Dereham). Carol Services are listed opposite but may be subject to cancellation under Covid-19 restrictions. To make things safer some of the small village church carol services have been relocated to a larger church where there is greater scope of social distancing (see church notice boards and social media about free tickets to carol services). Singing of carols will be led by socially distanced singers, under the current rules congregation will be limited to humming. There will be many who remain isolating or worried about attending a carol service but will still be able to access a benefice Carol Service which will be on YouTube from Sunday 20th December onwards (see above for details).

All our Christingle Services have been cancelled as we cannot keep distances. This is a huge disappointment to us but we do plan to have Christingles that can be collected from the churches in kit form and a Christingle celebration service than can be viewed at home on Christmas Eve via our YouTube channel. Donations for the work of the Children's Society can be left when Christingles are collected.

St Nicholas Gift Weekend - 5th and 6th

December: This year has been different in so many ways. There are so many things that we are unable to do - spend time with friends, go on holiday, hug celebrate other people, special occasions and attend weddings and funerals of people we love - among other things. However, it has given us the opportunity to do other things - to take stock of life, to appreciate small acts of kindness, to read the Bible, to listen to what God wants us to do. It has also enabled us to think about different ways of giving. Usually, we celebrate our patronal festival with the Toy Service. We have remembered St. Nicholas obeying Jesus by selling what he had to give money to the poor. We have remembered the legend of his throwing gold coins into the house of a poor man to provide a dowry for his three daughters and the coins landing in their stockings.

But this year is different. The needs of our neighbours in this time of pandemic are much greater.

Jesus said the first commandment was to love God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength and the second commandment was to love your neighbour as yourself. (Mark 12: 29 – 31)

We are asking that on St. Nicholastide, Saturday 5th and Sunday 6th, that you make a gift to either or both of the following worthwhile causes:

Our Neighbours in Dereham

For many families in Dereham this year has been tough. Some have lost jobs, work shorter hours or have rent arrears from the first lockdown. To help those in greatest need we propose to support the Food Bank in their preparation of Christmas fare for families. These are the goods they have asked for:
